POLICY:

The Department utilizes special procedures regarding interviewing offenders already under correctional supervision.

PROCEDURE:

1. The interviewer completes the Pretrial Interview (200A) if required by the Supervisor.
2. The interviewer contacts the supervising staff and informs them of the offense for which the offender was arrested, secures verification of the information the offender provided, and obtains a release recommendation.
3. The supervising staff recommendation may deviate from the point system for the following reasons:
 - A. The supervising staff has reason to believe that the offender may abscond as a result of the new arrest.
 - B. The nature and circumstances of the new offense;
 - C. The offender's failure to maintain contact or residence as required by the supervising staff;
 - D. The offender is a parolee who has been arrested for a felony, aggravated misdemeanor or a serious misdemeanor of an assaultive nature;
 - E. One or more of the criteria contained within the Community Protection Guidelines (200, Procedure 7) are present.
4. If the offender is released to supervision, the supervising agent or Residential Probation/Parole Officer assumes supervision of the offender.
5. The supervising agent/Residential Probation/Parole Officer reports to the Court on the offender's progress as appropriate.
