POLICY:

Staff submits a report of violation to the Court recommending revocation of the defendant's release with supervision when the defendant commits serious and/or repeated violations of the release conditions.

PROCEDURE:

1. Staff reviews the offender's case with the Supervisor and determines the appropriateness for submission of a Pretrial Release Report of Violation (209A).
2. Staff may write a Violation Report requesting revocation of bond provisions when one or more of the following conditions exist:
 - A. Behavior which presents a serious danger to community or self;
 - B. Offender is arrested for a crime, which in the opinion of staff presents a threat to person or persons if the offender is not detained, or if the offender is rearrested for a like or more serious offense.
 - C. Offender has absconded;
 - D. Offender continues to violate release conditions which are outlined in previous Notice of Arrest (208A) or Violation Reports submitted to the Court.
3. Pretrial staff prepares the Violation Report
4. The Violation Report is submitted via email to the County Attorney, who forwards the report and accompanying court documents to the Presiding Judge and Defense Attorney. A copy is maintained in the pretrial staff file. If the case originated from another District, the Violation Report is filed per local procedure by the Secondary Case Manager.
