I understand that information developed through this examination will be released to:

DCS staff, group facilitator(s), treatment provider(s), and any law enforcement/ criminal justice agency deemed necessary.

I understand the information developed through this examination may be used for program evaluation, professional development, or training activities that have no bearing on the test result or actions that result from the test result.

I understand the information developed through this examination may be released for research purposes.

The polygraph examination is divided into four separate phases:

1. Background Information

You will be asked to provide necessary information about yourself which will help the polygraph examiner in getting to know you so the proper techniques for the testing process can be established. Such things as your current medical conditions, employment and education.

2. Discussion of Case Facts and Test Issues

You and the examiner will fully discuss the issues and reasons for the examination. During this phase, reports are reviewed, and a thorough discussion of all pertinent information will occur.

3. Development of Questions

You and the examiner will formulate all of the actual questions, which are asked during instrumentation. Each of these questions will be answered with either "YES" or "NO". Every effort will be made to make the questions as clear as possible. There are no trick questions nor will we attempt to mislead you. We want to know for sure that you are telling the absolute truth to every question on the examination.

4. Instrumentation

This is the actual time you are answering the "YES" or "NO" questions while seated in the examining chair and attached to the polygraph instrument. This phase takes about 30 minutes to complete, since the test is repeated several times.

I understand that the purpose of this examination is to verify that I am telling the truth to all examination questions. I agree to assist the examiner during this process by telling the truth during all of our discussions and by cooperating and following all instructions.

I do hereby release and forever hold harmless the Polygraph Examiner from any and all claims of liability relating to or arising out of the operation of the polygraph instrument or the use of the results obtained therefrom.
